### **Ainsworth Maternal Sensitivity Scales**

The most sensitive mother--the one with the lowest threshold--is alert to the baby's most subtle, minimal, understated cues Mothers with higher thresholds seem to perceive only the most blatant and obvious communications, Mothers with the highest thresholds seem often oblivious, and are, in effect, highly inaccessible This second
