Papel picado ("perforated paper," "pecked paper") is a decorative craft made by cutting elaborate designs into sheets of tissue paper. Papel picado is considered a Mexican folk art. The designs are commonly cut from as many as 40-50 colored tissue paper stacked together and using a guide or template, a small mallet, and chisels, creating as many as fifty banners at a time.

Papel picado is decoratively cut paper that is used in Mexico for decorations for all holidays and fiestas. For Day of the Dead, papel picado is placed around the edges of the altar, and adds color to the altar. Some say that the four elements are present in the altar and the movement of the papel picado represents air.

Papel Picado; Papel picado means perforated paper and is an integral part of Mexican culture. The art comes from the Aztec tradition of chiseling spirit figures on wood. It is used during Day of the Dead celebrations by stringing them on the altars and in the streets. Ofrendas showcase fire, water, earth, and air.
