Through her, Burns was descended from the Little Bear/Strike Axe band of Little Osages, and was a member of the tribe's Mottled Eagle Clan. He was one-eighth Osage/Kansas, and his Osage name was Hulah Kiheka (Eagle Chief). He became a member of the I'n Lon Schka Society, which organizes the important ceremonial dance.
